I have attached a spreadsheet with the replies, any comments returned, and a summary of which houses replied/didn't and what they said, so you can see all the correspondence. I have scanned a copy of the online survey, and copies of the emails I received with paper copies returned.

- out of the 18 houses I delivered to, there are 13 approvals and no objections. Three supportive replies included comments that I feel are manageable within our planning.
- 5 residents/houses have not replied. 2 of these were away (according to neighbours), 2 have not replied to any calls or door knocking I have tried at different times, and 1 person I spoke to said they would complete the survey but haven't yet.

After talking to the residents of xxxxxxxxxxx, I agreed to test my suggested floodlighting of the area for the overnight match. I did this on Friday night, I am not sure if they saw it (as they haven't been in when I have tried their house since to ask) After talking to xxxxxxxxxxxxx, I tested putting this pitch further away from the pavilion and Lucas Lane, in the unmarked space between the cricket square and the horse field. This was without any of the pavilion lights on, and just the Accies battery-powered portable lights. I think this arrangement could work well for our overnight hours.

I hope this is enough to make a decision on the event on Thursday 10th April, as planned.
